Learning objective: To recall and apply common Spanish greetings and basic introductions correctly.

What might happen if you used 'Buenos días' at 9:00 PM? 5. Create a short dialogue between two characters meeting for the first time using at least four phrases from the word bank. 6. Research: Can you find out why Spanish uses upside-down question marks (¿) at the start of questions?
