

Rosa's Hobbies Adventure: Mis Pasatiempos

Learning objective: To express personal hobbies in Spanish using the verb 'gustar' and identify common leisure activities.

Read the activity list and use the vocabulary provided to complete the exercises. Remember that when we talk about hobbies we like, we use 'Me gusta...' (I like) or 'Me gustan...' (I like, for plural nouns).

Word bank: Jugar al fútbol - To play football · Leer libros - To read books · Escuchar música - To listen to music · Dibujar - To draw · Nadar - To swim · Montar en bicicleta - To ride a bike · Me gusta - I like (singular) · Me gustan - I like (plural)

1. Rosa wants to talk about her hobbies. Translate these two sentences into Spanish: 'I like to read books' and 'I like to draw'. (2 marks)

2. If you wanted to say 'I like swimming', why do we use 'Me gusta' instead of 'Me gustan'? Explain your reasoning. (2 marks)

3. Look at the word bank. Write a sentence explaining one hobby you like and one hobby you do not like using 'No me gusta'. (2 marks)

4. If Pip the caterpillar says 'Me gustan los libros' (I like books), why is the word 'gustan' used here instead of 'gusta'? (2 marks)

5. Match the following activities to their Spanish translation: 1. Cycling, 2. Listening to music, 3. Football. (3 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of yourself participating in your favorite hobby. Label your drawing in Spanish using the phrase 'Me gusta...' followed by your chosen activity.



Extension challenge: Write a short paragraph in Spanish (3-4 sentences) describing the hobbies of two different friends. Use 'A mi amigo le gusta...' (My friend likes...) for each person.
