

¡Bienvenidos a la Escuela! (Welcome to School!)

¡Explora tu clase con Rosa! Learn the words that make your school day special.

- The word 'la mochila' starts with 'la'. This tells us that in Spanish, the backpack is treated as a feminine noun.
- When you are in your classroom, you might say 'el aula', which means the room where you learn your lessons.
- If you need to write a story, you would use 'el lápiz' to record your brilliant ideas on paper.
- Every student looks forward to 'el recreo', which is the time during the day to play outside with friends.
- A 'profesor' or 'profesora' is the person who guides your learning and helps you discover new facts.

Did you know? Did you know? In Spanish, nouns have a 'gender'. Words for things like 'pencil' (el lápiz) are often masculine, while words for things like 'backpack' (la mochila) are often feminine! Rosa the parrot loves practising these with her friends.
