Learning objective: To use Spanish vocabulary to describe school subjects, opinions, and daily routines, and to justify personal preferences.

Welcome to your Spanish school diary! Use the vocabulary bank to complete the sections below. You are writing about your own school day in Spanish. Try to use connective words like 'y' (and), 'pero' (but), and 'porque' (because) to add detail to your answers. Challenge yourself to use higher-level adjectives to explain your reasoning.

Word bank: las matemáticas (math) · el inglés (English) · las ciencias (science) · el arte (art) · la educación física (PE) · me gusta (I like) · no me gusta (I do not like) · es interesante (it is interesting) · es difícil (it is difficult) · es divertido (it is fun) · porque (because) · pero (but)

1. Mi asignatura favorita: Write down your favorite subject and explain why you enjoy it using 'porque'. (2 marks)

2. Una asignatura difícil: Write down a subject you find challenging and explain how you feel during that lesson. (2 marks)

3. Comparación: Compare two subjects. Which one do you prefer and why? Justify your answer. (3 marks)

4. Análisis: Explain why it is important to study subjects you might find difficult. (3 marks)

5. Predicción: What might happen if you had to study your least favorite subject all day long? Explain your thoughts. (4 marks)

6. Evaluación: If you were the teacher, which new subject would you add to the timetable and why? (4 marks)

Extension challenge: Write a short paragraph in Spanish describing your ideal school day. Include what time you arrive, your favorite lesson, and what you eat for lunch. Use descriptive adjectives to paint a picture for your reader.
