

Rosa's Spanish Clock Challenge

Learning objective: To tell the time in Spanish using the 'es la' and 'son las' structures, including quarter past and half past.

Join Rosa the parrot as she practices her Spanish telling the time! Read each question carefully and select or write the correct Spanish phrase.
