

Rosa's Rhythmic Spanish Verbs Challenge

Learning objective: To understand and apply basic Spanish verb forms, including infinitives and present tense patterns for regular verbs.

Join Rosa the parrot on a linguistic adventure! Read each question carefully and select or write the correct Spanish verb form. Remember to look for the patterns in the endings.

Answer Key: 1. A (Hablar), 2. False, 3. -ir, 4. B (Comen), 5. True, 6. Bailo, 7. C (Viven), 8. True, 9. -er, 10. Hablas. Explanation: Spanish verbs change their endings based on who is performing the action and the type of verb (-ar, -er, or -ir).

6. 6. If the infinitive is 'Bailar' (to dance), what is the 'Yo' form? (Hint: remove -ar and add -o). (1 mark)

7. 7. Which form is correct for 'They live'? A) Vivimos B) Vives C) Viven* D) Vivo (1 mark)

8. 8. True or False: 'Comer' is an -er verb. (1 mark)

9. 9. What is the suffix of the verb 'Beber' (to drink)? (1 mark)

10. 10. If 'Hablar' means to speak, how would you say 'You speak' using the informal 'Tú' form? (1 mark)

What might happen to the meaning of a sentence if you used the wrong verb ending? 5. Create a short poem in Spanish using at least three different verbs. 6. Investigate: If you learned that 'jugar' (to play) is an irregular verb, how might its conjugation differ from a regular -ar verb?
