

Rosa's Weather Report: ¡El Tiempo!

Join Rosa the parrot and learn how to talk about the weather in Spanish!

- When the sun is shining brightly in the sky, you say: 'Hace sol'.
- If you need to wear a thick coat because the temperature is low, you say: 'Hace frío'.
- When you see grey clouds covering the sky, you say: 'Está nublado'.
- If you are splashing in puddles with your boots on, you say: 'Llueve'.
- On a day when your kite flies very high in the sky, you say: 'Hace viento'.
- When you are enjoying an ice cream on a hot summer day, you say: 'Hace calor'.

Did you know? Did you know? In Spain, the weather changes depending on which region you visit! While it might be raining in the north near the mountains, it could be bright and sunny on the southern coast. Rosa says it is always good to check the 'pronóstico del tiempo' (weather forecast) before you head out on an adventure!
