

Sheet 2: The 'ch' Digraph

Worked example:

Say the sounds: c-h-i-p. Put them together to read: chip.

Answer: chip

- **Read these 'ch' words aloud with Pip the caterpillar:**

chip chop chin much rich

- **Trace the 'ch' sound in these words:**

ch-ip ch-op ch-in

- **Add 'ch' to finish the word for these pictures:**

___in (a part of your face) ___op (to cut vegetables) mu___ (a lot of something)

- **Draw a line to match the word to the sound:**

chip - ch ship - sh chop - ch wish - sh

- **Write the word 'rich' and the word 'chin' on the lines below:**

rich chin

Self-check: Check that your 'ch' sounds look neat and you can read all the words aloud to a friend.
