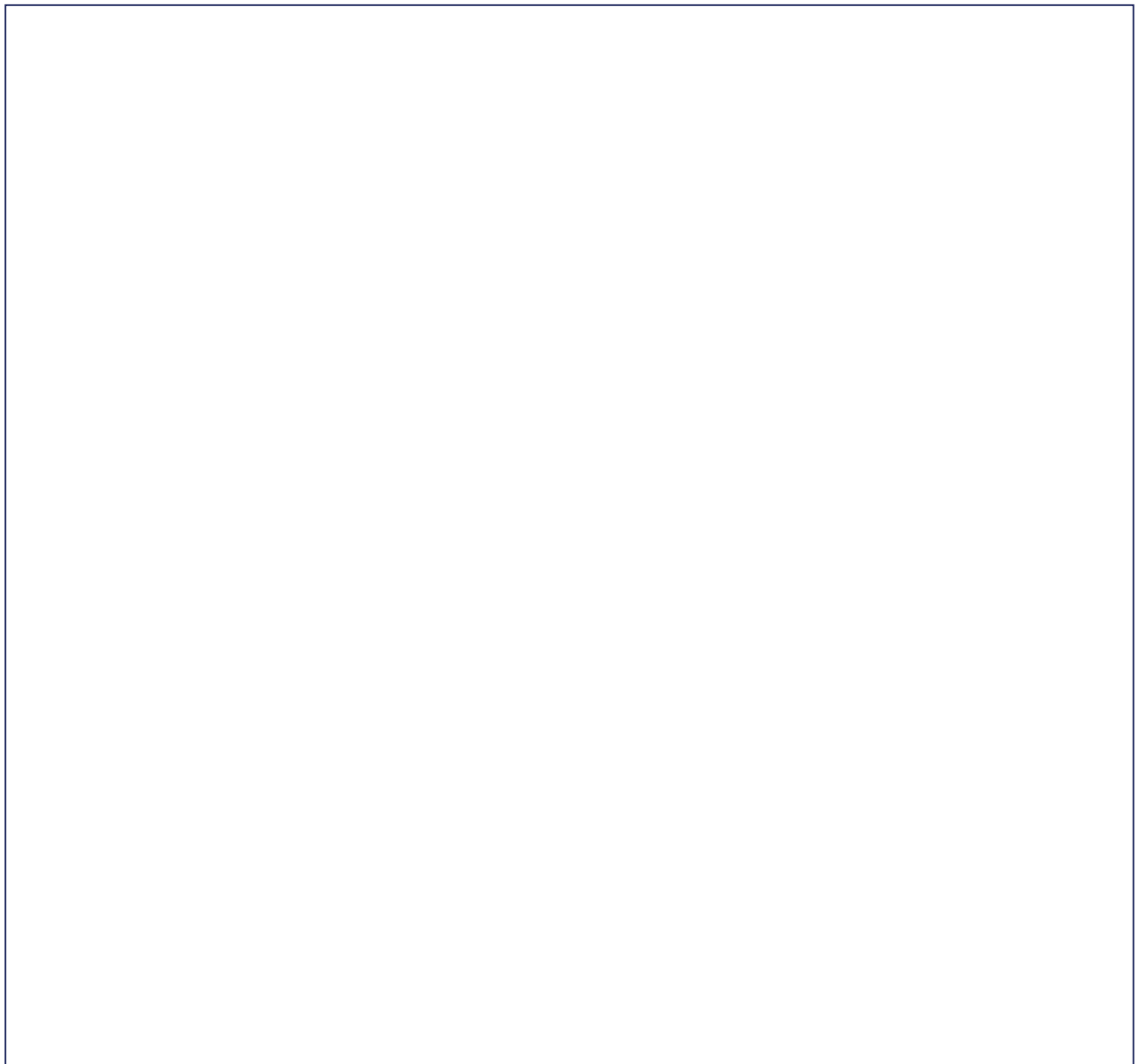


Zara's Colourful Garden

Learning objective: To explore primary colours and discover how they can be mixed to create new colours.

Help Zara the zebra bring her garden to life! Use red, yellow, and blue crayons to colour the primary shapes, then see if you can mix them to colour the flowers.

Colour this: A large, friendly zebra named Zara standing in a garden. Zara has simple, bold stripes. Around her are three large flowers with circular centres and petal outlines. One flower has a large letter 'R' inside (for Red), one has 'Y' (for Yellow), and one has 'B' (for Blue). In the background, draw two smaller flowers that are half-shaded with patterns to show where colours meet. Include a bright sun in the corner and a few simple shapes of leaves on stems for the children to colour green.



Steps:

1. Label the primary colour flower in your picture.
2. Label the secondary colour leaf in your picture.
