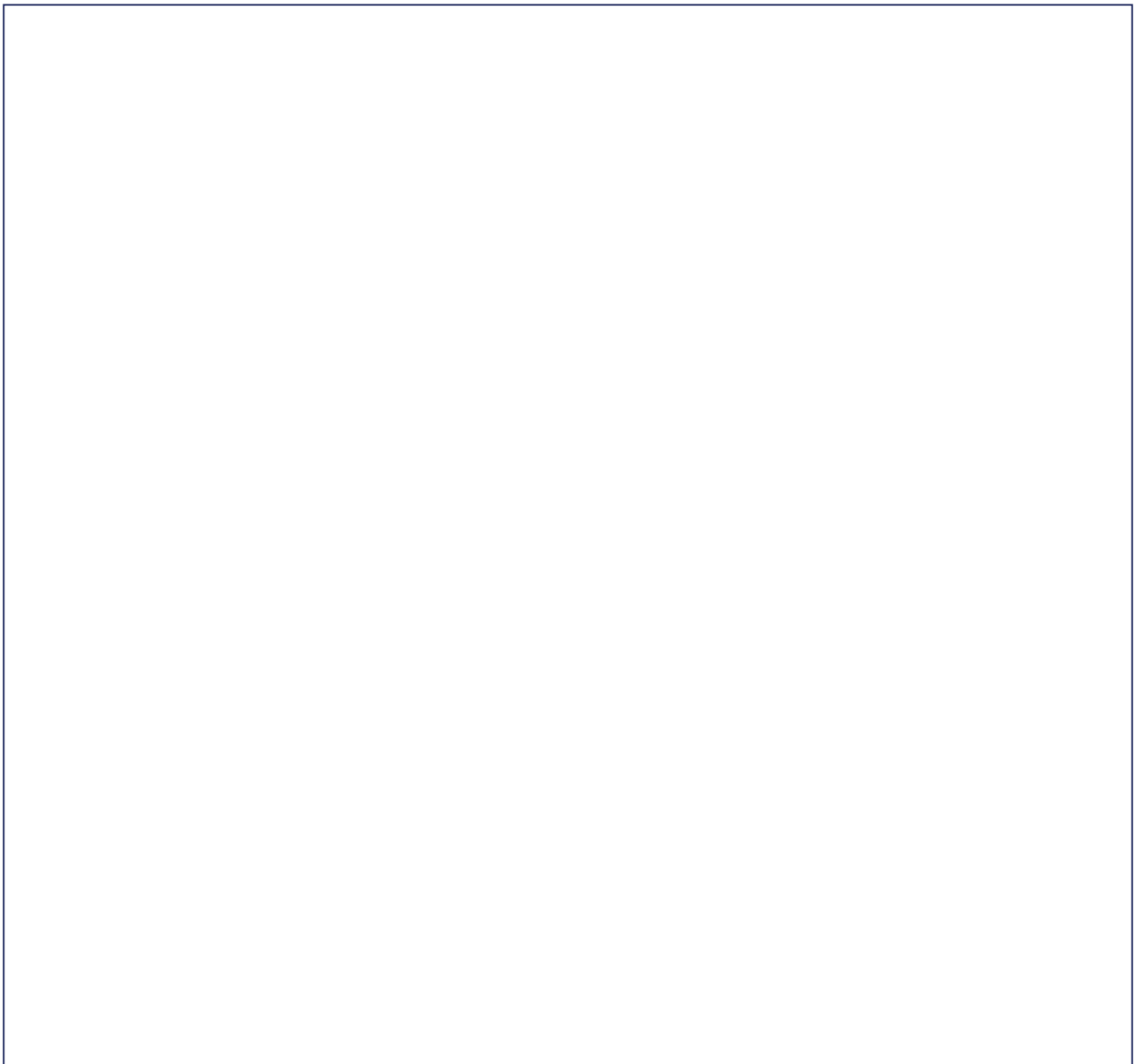


Zara's Impressionist Garden

Learning objective: To explore the style of Claude Monet by identifying light and colour in nature.

Look at the beautiful garden scene below. Zara the Zebra is painting 'en plein air' (outdoors). Use your brightest colours to fill in the flowers and the water, just like the artist Claude Monet did. Think about how the light makes the colours change!

Colour this: A peaceful garden scene designed for colouring. In the foreground, there is a small wooden bridge arching over a pond. On the pond, there are large, rounded lily pads.
