

Zara's Sketching Secrets

Grab your pencil and let's explore the world through art!

- A sketch is a quick, rough drawing that helps you plan your final piece of artwork.
- Varying your pencil pressure helps you create different shades, from very light greys to deep, dark blacks.
- You can create texture by using short, quick marks like dashes, dots, or wiggly lines.
- Shading is the technique of adding shadow to your sketch to make objects look 3D rather than flat.
- Zara the Zebra loves to use a blending stump or her finger to gently smooth out her pencil marks for a soft finish.

Did you know? Did you know that artists often use a light 'ghost line' to sketch their shapes first? By drawing very softly with your pencil, you can easily rub out mistakes before you add the final details!
