

Zara's Magical Watercolour Wonders

Grab your brush, add a splash of water, and watch the colours dance across your paper!

- Watercolour paint is special because it is transparent, which means you can see the paper underneath your paint.
- To start painting, dip your brush into clean water and swirl it gently in your paint pot to wake up the colour.
- You can create a beautiful 'wash' by adding extra water to your brush to make the colour spread out across the page.
- If you want to make a new colour, try blending two colours together on your paper while they are still wet.
- Always remember to rinse your brush in your water pot before choosing a new colour so your paints stay bright and clean.

Did you know? Did you know? If you paint with a little bit of water, your colours will be dark and bold, but if you add lots of water, your colours will look soft, light, and dreamy like a summer cloud!
