

Connecting Sentences with Conjunctions

- **Coordinating conjunctions join two parts of a sentence that are equally important. Remember the acronym FANBOYS: For, And, Nor, But, Or, Yet, So.**
- **Subordinating conjunctions add extra information to a sentence. Examples include: because, although, if, since, while, and when.**
- **Place a comma before a coordinating conjunction when it joins two independent clauses.**
- **You do not usually need a comma if the subordinating conjunction comes in the middle of the sentence.**
- **Using conjunctions makes your writing more interesting for the reader to enjoy.**
