Learning objective: To retrieve information, make inferences, and express personal opinions about a text.

Read the story below. Use the word bank if you need help. Fill in the boxes to answer the questions.

Max the monkey stood at the sunny town market. He loved market day because it was a big maths puzzle to solve. Max had £5.00 in his small blue bag. He walked to a stall filled with bright, juicy apples. The sign said each apple cost 50p. Max wanted to buy three apples for his friends. He thought carefully about the total price. He knew that three times 50p was £1.50. Max handed the farmer £1.50. The farmer smiled and gave Max his change. Max felt very happy. He had £3.50 left in his bag. He could now buy some yummy carrots for his lunch too. Max loved using his numbers to help him shop. He carefully counted his coins to make sure he had the right amount. Being clever with money meant he could share snacks with everyone. Max walked home with his bag full of treats, feeling proud that he had managed his money so well.
