Think Like a Fox: Crack the Code of Words!

- **Synonyms** are words that have the same or very similar meanings, such as 'happy' and 'cheerful'. Finding these helps you expand your vocabulary range.
- **Antonyms** are opposites, like 'bright' and 'dim'. Identifying these helps you understand the contrast between different ideas.
- **Analogies** show a relationship between pairs of words. If 'A is to B as C is to D', you must find the connection between the first pair to solve the second.
- **Word codes** often involve shifting letters in the alphabet. If A=B and B=C, you are using a simple substitution cipher to hide or reveal a message.
- **Suffixes and prefixes** change the meaning of a root word. Adding 'un-' to 'tidy' creates an antonym, while adding '-ness' to 'kind' creates a noun.
- **Logical sequences** require you to spot the odd one out. Always look for a shared characteristic, such as all words starting with a vowel, to find the intruder.
