

Finn's Big Ocean Adventure

Learning objective: To identify and name the world's seven continents and five oceans.

Read the story about Finn the dolphin carefully. Use the word bank to help you spell the names of the places. Answer the questions in the boxes provided.

Finn the dolphin loves to swim across the big, blue world. He starts his journey in the Atlantic Ocean. He sees the coast of Africa. It is very warm there. Next, Finn swims north to find Europe. He knows that the Earth is made of seven large pieces of land called continents. These continents are surrounded by five deep oceans. Finn enjoys splashing in the Pacific Ocean because it is the biggest one of all. He uses his map to make sure he does not get lost. Finn thinks the world is like a giant puzzle. Every continent has a special name, and every ocean is full of life. From the cold water near the poles to the sunny beaches, Finn loves exploring. He knows that learning about geography helps us understand our home. Whether he is near a continent or in the middle of a vast ocean, Finn is always happy to learn something new. He invites you to look at a globe and find the places he has visited today.
