Learning objective: To recognise that Black History Month is a time to learn about and celebrate the achievements of Black people throughout history and today.

Read the questions carefully and write your answers on the lines provided. Think about the brave and clever people we have learned about in class.

Black History Month is a special time of year when we learn about the important things Black people have done for our world. We look back at history to see how people used their courage, talent, and kindness to make our lives better today. Ellie the Elephant says that remembering these stories helps us be better friends to everyone.

2. If you could ask a brave person from history one question, what would you ask them? (2 marks)

3. Ellie the Elephant says we should remember these stories. How does learning about other people help us be a good friend? (2 marks)

4. Name one thing you think makes a person 'brave'. (1 mark)

5. True or False: Black History Month is only about things that happened a long time ago. Circle your answer. (1 mark)
