Learning objective: To recall key facts about the Great Fire of London and understand why it happened in 1666.

Read the front of the card and try to remember the answer. Flip the card over (or look at the text after the line) to check if you are right! Join Ellie the elephant as she explores this important event in history.

Where did the Great Fire of London start?

A bakery on Pudding Lane

What were most houses in London made of in 1666?

Wood (timber) and straw

Why did the fire spread so quickly between the houses?

The houses were built very close together

Who wrote a famous diary about the fire?

Samuel Pepys

What river did many people go to for safety?

The River Thames

What did people use to try and put out the fire?

Leather buckets and water squirts

Did the fire last for one day or several days?

Several days (it lasted from Sunday to Thursday)

What was the weather like when the fire started?

It was very dry and windy

What did they use to rebuild London after the fire?

Brick and stone, which were safer than wood
