

Year 4 History Assessment: Remembrance Day

Learning objective: To understand the history and importance of Remembrance Day.

Read each question carefully. Use the word bank to help you with your writing. Write your answers in the spaces provided.

Remembrance Day is held on the 11th of November every year. It marks the time when fighting stopped in the First World War. People wear a red poppy to show they remember the soldiers who fought for our country. We show respect by staying quiet for two minutes at 11 o'clock.
