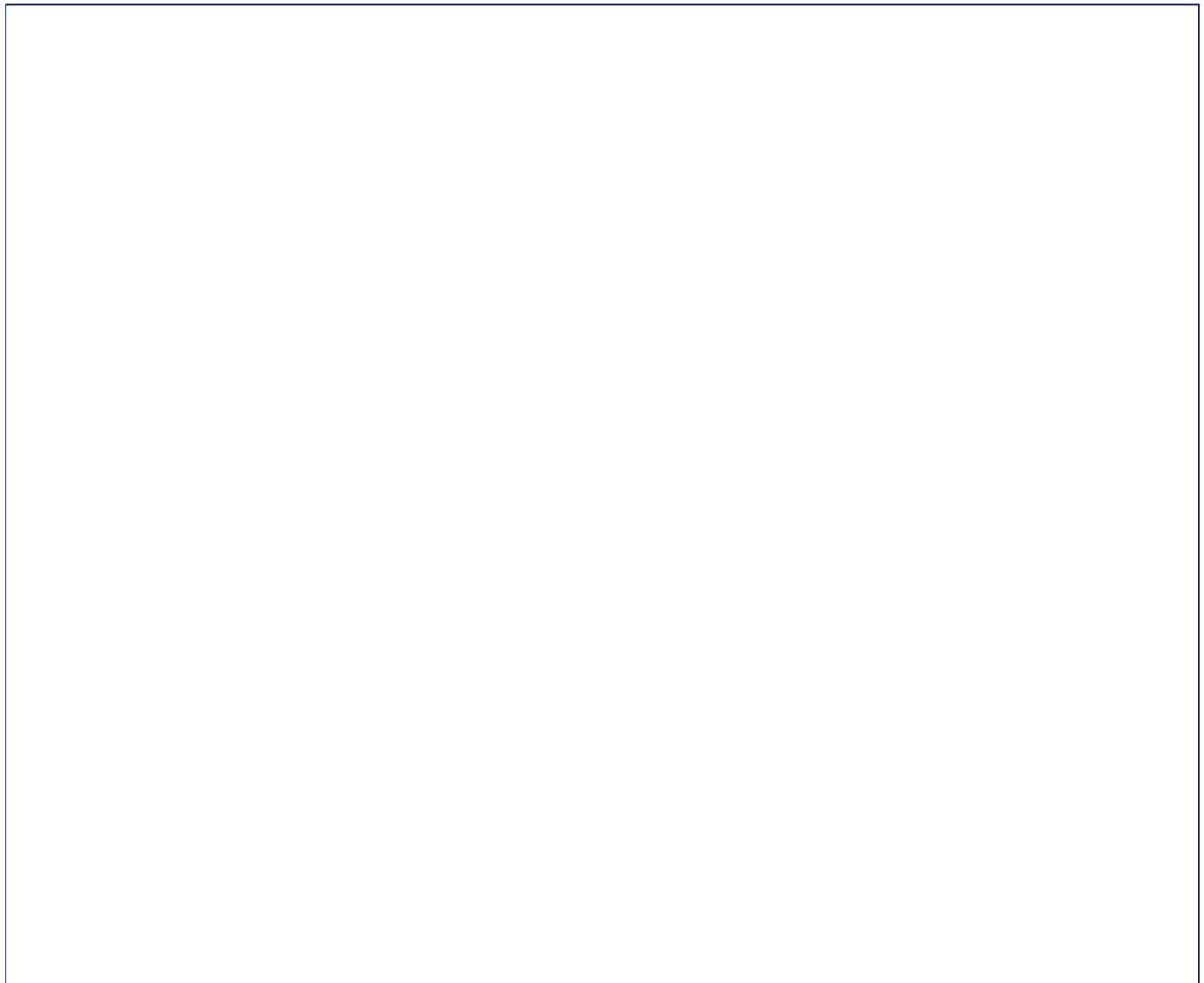


Max's Easter Egg Shop

Learning objective: To solve simple addition and subtraction problems involving money and recognise values of coins up to £2.

Help Max the monkey organise his Easter stall! Read the questions carefully, draw the items, and calculate the prices to help him finish his maths puzzle.

Draw: Draw a cheerful scene featuring Max the monkey standing behind a wooden stall. On the stall, draw a display of Easter eggs of different sizes, a small woven basket, and some handmade price tags. Use a clean, bright, cartoon style with clear outlines. Make sure there is plenty of white space around the items so children can draw their own coins or total amounts next to them.



Label words: Easter egg · Basket · Price tag · Penny · Pound coin · Total

Steps:

1. Max has one large Easter egg that costs £2 and a small one that costs £1. Draw both eggs and write the total cost of both in the box.
2. A customer gives Max a £5 note for a £3 basket of treats. How much change should Max give back? Draw the coins he gives as change.
3. Max has 4 chocolate bunnies. He sells 2. How many bunnies does he have left? Draw the bunnies that

are left.

4. If a ribbon costs 50p and a sticker costs 20p, what is the total cost? Write the answer in pence.

5. Draw a price tag next to your Easter egg showing a price of £1.
