

Max the Monkey's Fraction Fun!

Jump into fractions with Max and see how parts make a whole!

- The top number is the Numerator. It tells us how many equal parts we have.
- The bottom number is the Denominator. It tells us how many equal parts make one whole.
- When we write a fraction, we draw a line between the two numbers to separate them.
- For a fraction to be fair, every part must be exactly the same size. These are called equal parts.
- If you have 1 whole banana and cut it into 4 equal pieces, each piece is one quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$).

Did you know? Did you know? The word 'fraction' comes from the Latin word 'fractio', which means 'to break'. Fractions are just a way of showing how we have broken a whole object into equal pieces!
