

Max's Market Maths Assessment

Learning objective: To solve problems involving money in Australian dollars and cents.

Hello! I am Max the monkey. Use my maths skills to help me at the market. Read each question carefully. Use the word bank if you get stuck.

Max is buying fruit for his friends. A banana costs £1.20. An apple costs £0.80. A bunch of grapes costs £2.50.

Word bank: Total · Change · Pence · Pounds · Decimal point · Subtract · Add

1. Max buys one banana (£1.20) and one apple (£0.80). What is the total cost? (2 marks)

2. Max has a £5.00 note. He spends £2.50 on grapes. How much change does he get back? (3 marks)

3. Circle the correct way to write fifty pence using a pound sign: A) £0.50 B) £5.00 C) £0.05 (2 marks)

4. Pip the caterpillar wants 3 apples. Each apple costs £0.80. How much do 3 apples cost in total? Show your working out. (4 marks)

5. Max has £10.00. He buys a bag of nuts for £3.20 and a drink for £1.50. How much money does he have left? Explain how you worked it out using the words from the word bank. (5 marks)

6. If a melon costs £4.00 and you pay with a £10.00 note, how many £1.00 coins will you get back as change? (4 marks)

7. Write these amounts in order from smallest to largest: £1.50, £0.99, £2.10, £0.50. (5 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of 4 coins that would add up to exactly £1.00.



Extension challenge: Total: /25. Challenge: If you had £20.00, could you buy 5 items that each cost £3.50? Show your maths.
