

Zara's Pattern and Shape Hunt

Learning objective: To recognise, name, and describe 2D shapes (square, circle, triangle, rectangle) and their properties.

Zara the zebra loves finding shapes hiding in everyday objects! Look at the list of objects below. Decide if each object is shaped like a square, a circle, a triangle, or a rectangle. Write the correct shape name next to each item.

Word bank: square · circle · triangle · rectangle

1. A slice of pizza. (1 mark)

2. A shiny gold coin. (1 mark)

3. A piece of paper for writing a letter. (1 mark)

4. A square-based tile on the kitchen floor. (1 mark)

5. How many sides does a triangle have? (1 mark)

6. Zara has a rectangle. If she cuts it in half to make two triangles, how many sides does one triangle have? (2 marks)

Draw: Zara is drawing a picture using only shapes. Draw a house for Zara using one square, one triangle, and one rectangle.



Extension challenge: Look around your classroom or home. Can you find an object that has a circle shape? What about a rectangle? List two things you found and name their shapes.
