

Mastering Team Games: Year 5 PE Flashcards

Learning objective: To understand the key tactics, rules, and sportsmanship required for success in competitive team games.

Read the front of the card to test your knowledge of team sports. Flip to the answer to check your understanding of effective teamwork.

Tactics A planned strategy used by a team to outwit their opponents and achieve a goal during a game.	Communication Using clear verbal cues or hand signals to help teammates understand where to move or when to pass the ball.
Sportsmanship Showing respect for your teammates, opponents, and officials, regardless of whether you win or lose.	Possession Having control of the ball or object of play, which allows a team to dictate the pace and create scoring chances.
Formation The specific layout or positioning of players on the pitch to balance attacking threats and defensive cover.	Intercept The act of stopping or catching a pass from the opposing team to gain possession for your own team.
Attack The phase of play where a team moves towards the opponent's target or goal area to try and score.	Defence The phase of play where a team tries to prevent the opposition from scoring by blocking shots or marking players.
Fair Play Adhering to the rules of the game and ensuring that the competition remains safe and equal for everyone involved.	How would Max (the maths-loving monkey) use a Formation? Max would use geometry to ensure players are spaced out evenly to cover as much space on the pitch as possible.
Why is it important to listen to a referee? The referee ensures the game is played safely and fairly, and their decisions are final to keep the game organised.	What is the primary goal of good teamwork? To combine individual skills effectively so that the team performs better than a group of individuals working alone.
