Learning objective: To understand the importance of kindness, identify ways to support others, and explain how our actions affect our school community.

2. 2. List two kind things that Max did to help Pip. (2 marks) (2 marks)

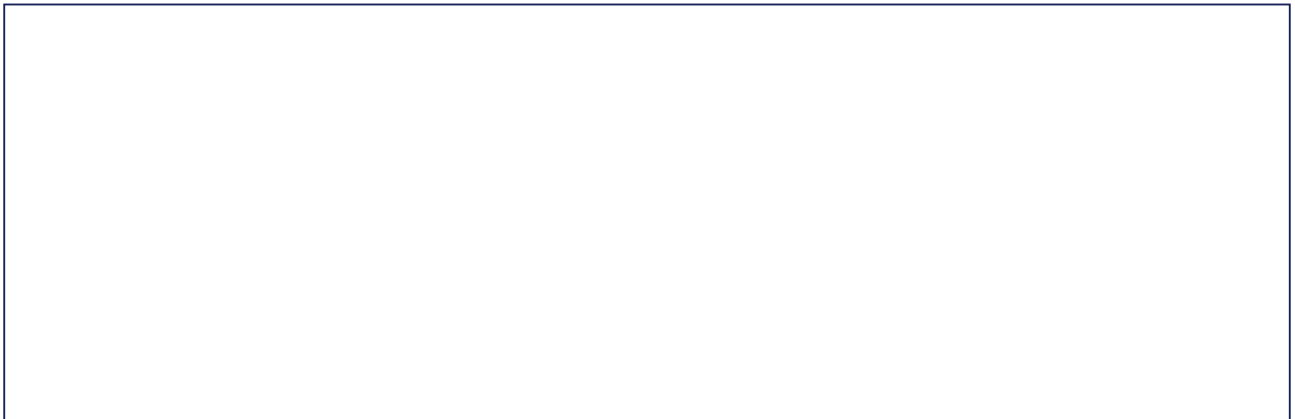
3. 3. What does the word 'empathy' mean? Use the word bank to help you. (2 marks) (2 marks)
