

Keeping Safe with Leo the Lion

Learning objective: To identify trusted adults and understand how to keep safe in different situations.

Leo the Lion is going on an adventure! Sometimes he needs a little help to stay safe. Look at the situations below. Sort them into two groups: 'Safe Choices' and 'Things to ask a Trusted Adult for help'. Draw a line from each situation to the correct basket.

1. You are at the park and you cannot find your grown-up. What is the first thing you should do? (2 marks)

2. Who are three people you can talk to if you feel worried or unsafe? (2 marks)

3. If a stranger offers you a sweet, should you take it? Why or why not? (2 marks)

4. Why is it important to hold a grown-up's hand when crossing a busy road? (2 marks)

5. If you are playing and you get a scrape on your knee, who should you go to for help? (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of yourself with your 'Trusted Adult' at the park, making sure you are holding hands to stay safe.
