

Year 4 RE Assessment: The Meaning of Christmas

Learning objective: To demonstrate understanding of the Christian celebration of Christmas, its meaning, and how it is observed.

Read each question carefully. Use the word bank to help you spell key words. Answer in the boxes provided.

For Christians, Christmas is a special time. It marks the birth of Jesus in Bethlehem. The story of his birth is called the Nativity. Before Christmas, there is a time called Advent. This is a time of waiting and preparing. Christians often share gifts to remember the love shown at Christmas.
