

Diwali: The Festival of Lights with Max the Monkey

Learning objective: To understand the meaning of Diwali and how it is celebrated by Hindus, Sikhs, and Jains.

Diwali is a special festival celebrated by many people. It is known as the Festival of Light. People light small oil lamps called diyas to show that light wins over darkness. Families clean their homes and make beautiful patterns on the floor called rangoli. They share sweets and spend time with their loved ones to celebrate goodness.

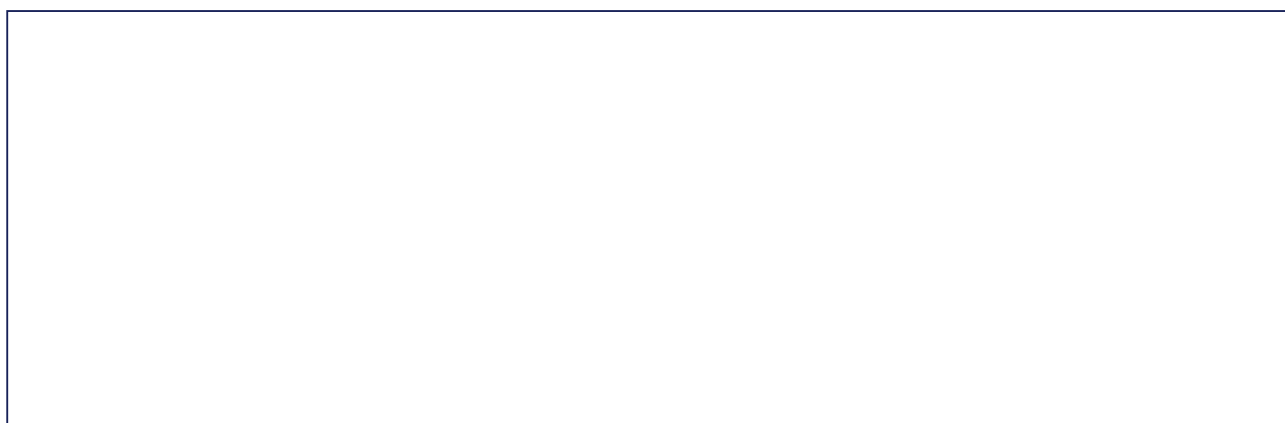
1. 1. What is another name for Diwali? (Hint: Think about what it celebrates!) (1 mark)
