

Making Good Choices: Moral Questions Flashcards

Learning objective: To understand what a moral question is and how to think about right and wrong.

Read the front of the card. Think about how you would answer. Then, look at the back of the card to learn more. You can talk about these with a friend or adult.

What is a moral question?

A question that asks us to think about what is right or wrong.

What does 'fair' mean?

Treating everyone in a way that is just and equal.

Is it always easy to know the right thing to do?

No, sometimes it is hard to decide which choice is best.

Why is kindness important?

Kindness helps us to care for others and makes the world a better place.

What is a 'choice'?

When you have to decide between two or more different actions.

What should you do if you see someone being unkind?

You can choose to be kind to them or ask a teacher for help.

Why do we have rules?

Rules help keep us safe and help us live together happily.

Does telling the truth always help?

Yes, being honest is important for trust, even when it is difficult.

How can you tell if an action is good?

Think about how your action makes others feel.

What does it mean to be 'responsible'?

It means you take care of your actions and do what you promised to do.

If you find £1 on the floor, what is the moral choice?

The moral choice is to try and find the person who lost it.

Can you change your mind about a choice?

Yes, it is okay to think again and try to do the right thing next time.
