

Zara's Colourful World: A Guide to Colour Theory

Explore the rainbow with Zara the Zebra and master the art of colour!

- The three primary colours are red, yellow, and blue. You cannot make these colours by mixing others together.
- Secondary colours are made by mixing two primary colours. For example, red plus yellow makes orange.
- Blue plus yellow mixed together makes the colour green.
- Red plus blue mixed together makes the colour purple.
- A colour wheel shows how colours relate to each other in a circle.

Did you know? Did you know? If you mix all the colours of light together, you get white light! But when you mix paints together, the more colours you add, the darker the mixture becomes.
