- A print is made when you press an object covered in paint onto a piece of paper.
- You can find interesting textures on leaves, sponges, or even the soles of your shoes.
- Pressing your object firmly helps the paint transfer clearly to your page.
- Repeating a shape across your paper creates a colourful pattern.
- Always remember to lift your stamp straight up so your print stays neat and tidy.
