

Zara's Sculpture Studio

Learning objective: To understand how sculptures have shape, texture, and form.

Zara the Zebra wants to make a sculpture for the school garden. Follow the steps below to design your own sculpture. Use your pencil to draw clear lines and add shading to show texture.

Draw: Draw a sculpture that Zara the Zebra could place in a garden. Your sculpture should look 3D. Make sure it has a solid base. Use cross-hatching or dots to show if the surface is rough or smooth. Imagine the sculpture is made of stone, metal, or wood.



Label words: Texture · Form · Base · 3D · Material

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw a wide, flat shape at the bottom of your page to be the base. Why is a strong base important for a sculpture?
2. Step 2: Draw a large shape on top of your base. Add lines to show if it is smooth, bumpy, or rough. What material is your sculpture made of?
3. Step 3: Label your drawing. Use three words from the word bank to point to parts of your sculpture.
4. Step 4: Think about the size. If Zara wanted to sell this sculpture for £25.00, what would you name it?
