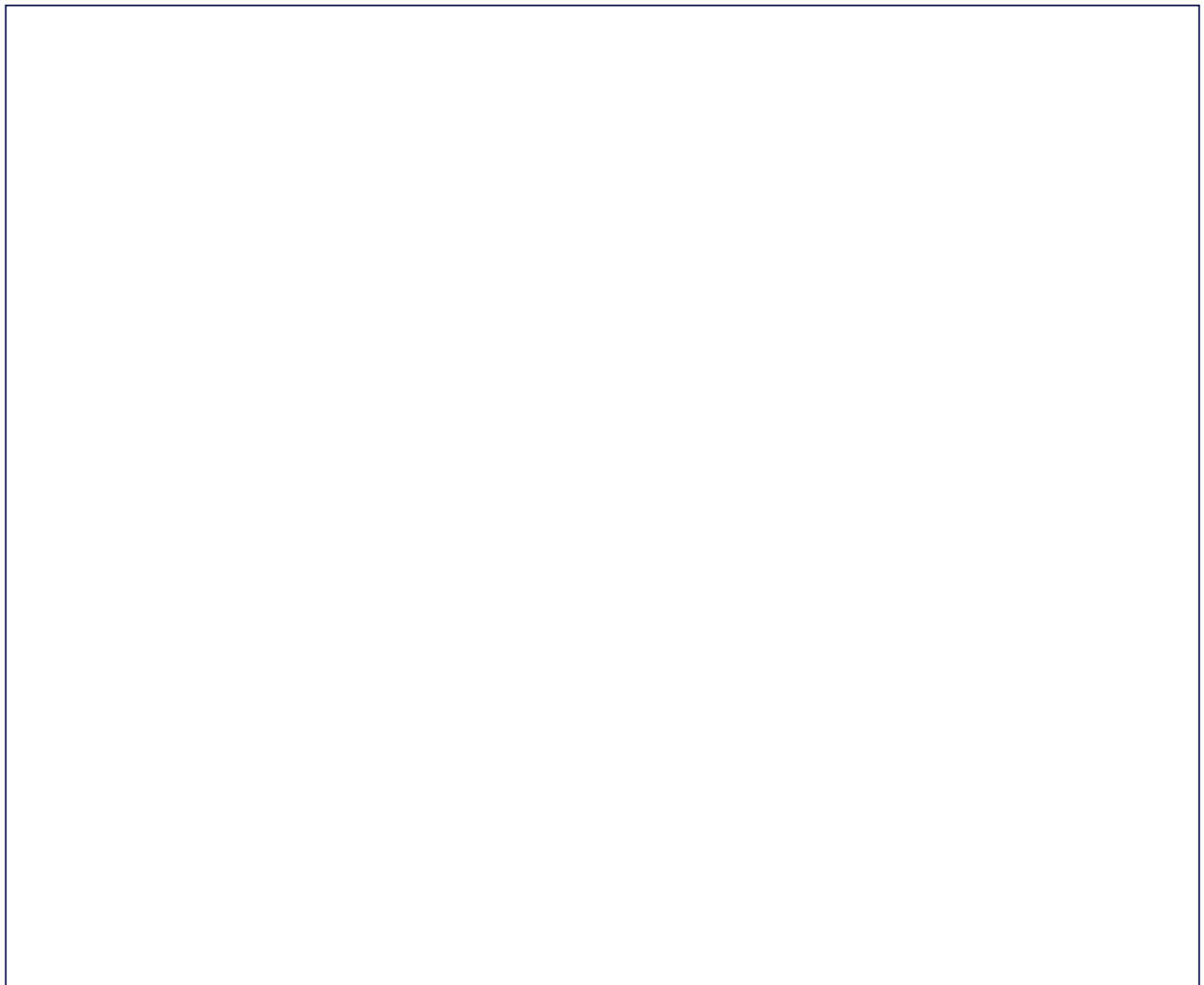


Zara's Sculpture Studio

Learning objective: To explore 3D shapes and patterns by designing a sculpture inspired by Zara the zebra's artistic style.

Zara the zebra loves to look at shapes all around her. Today, she wants to build a sculpture for the park. Use your pencils to draw a sculpture that uses different shapes stacked on top of each other. Think about patterns you can add to your sculpture to make it colourful!

Draw: Draw a tall, colourful sculpture in the middle of the paper. Use at least three different 3D shapes stacked on top of each other (like a cylinder, a cube, and a sphere). Surround your sculpture with a park setting, like grass or flowers. Use bright colours and include patterns like stripes or spots on the shapes.



Label words: cube · sphere · cylinder · pattern · stack · base

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw a large square 'base' at the bottom of your page so your sculpture doesn't fall over.
2. Step 2: Draw a circle (sphere) on top of your base. How many circles can you stack?
3. Step 3: Add a pattern to your sculpture. Will you draw spots, stripes, or zig-zags?
4. Comprehension: If your sculpture cost £2 to make, and you had a £5 note, how much change would you get?

5. Application: Why do we make the base of a sculpture wide and flat? (Hint: Think about balance!)
