Adverbs add action! Join Max as we zoom through our sentences.

- An adverb tells us more about a verb. A verb is a doing or action word like 'run', 'jump', or 'think'.
- You can find an adverb by asking: How is the action happening?
- Many adverbs are made by adding -ly to an adjective. Quick becomes quickly, and soft becomes softly.
- Adverbs can tell us about frequency, like 'often' or 'never', to show how much something happens.
- Using adverbs makes your stories much more exciting for the reader to enjoy!

Did you know? Did you know? Most adverbs that describe how something is done end in the letters -ly. For example, if a monkey climbs slowly, 'slowly' is the adverb telling us how he climbs!
