

Diwali: The Festival of Light with Pip the Caterpillar

Learning objective: To recall key facts about the story of Diwali and understand why it is celebrated.

Read the story summary below. Then, answer the questions. Use the Word Bank if you need help. You can do this!

Diwali is the Festival of Light. It is a special time for many families. The story tells of Prince Rama and his wife, Sita. They had been away for a long time. They were finally travelling back to their kingdom. The people were very happy they were returning. To help them find their way in the dark, the people lit many small clay lamps called diyas. They placed them in rows to show the path. It was a victory of good over evil. Today, people celebrate by sharing food, wearing new clothes, and lighting diyas to welcome goodness into their homes.
