- A fronted adverbial sits at the very start of a sentence.
- Always place a comma after the fronted adverbial to separate it from the rest of the sentence.
- Time adverbials tell us when: 'After the bell, the children ran outside.'
- Place adverbials tell us where: 'In the deep forest, the owl waited.'
- Manner adverbials tell us how: 'With a happy grin, Max solved the puzzle.'

Did you know? Did you know? A fronted adverbial is like a spotlight at the start of a sentence. It tells the reader when, where, or how something happens before the main action even begins!
