

Punctuation Power with Max and Kit

Learning objective: To identify and use different types of punctuation correctly in sentences.

Read the front of each card to see the punctuation mark or question. Flip it over to check your answer! Use the word bank to help you.

.	A
Full stop. Used to end a sentence that makes a statement.	Capital letter. Used at the start of a sentence or for names.
?	!
Question mark. Used at the end of a sentence that asks something.	Exclamation mark. Used to show strong feelings like surprise or shouting.
,	'
Comma. Used to separate items in a list or to pause in a sentence.	Apostrophe. Used to show possession or missing letters in a word.
" "	What marks the start of a sentence?
Speech marks. Used to show exactly what a character is saying.	A capital letter.
Which mark goes at the end of 'How are you?'	Which mark shows that the dog belongs to Max?
A question mark.	An apostrophe (Max's dog).
Which mark shows Kit is shouting 'Look out!'?	What do we use to separate items like apples, pears and bananas?
An exclamation mark.	A comma.
