Become a Reading Detective with Pip!

- When you predict, you use clues to guess what might happen next in the story.
- To find evidence, look back at the text to find the exact words that prove your answer.
- Making an inference means using what you already know and the clues in the book to work out how a character feels.
- A summary is a short way to tell someone the most important parts of the story in your own words.
- If you find a new word you do not know, check the sentences around it for clues about what it means.
