

Reporting on the Rare Moon-Flower

Learning objective: To identify and label the key features of a non-chronological report using a visual layout.

Help Nova the owl create a fact sheet about the magical Moon-Flower. Follow the drawing steps and use the labels provided to show the parts of a report.

Draw: Draw a large, glowing Moon-Flower in the centre of the page. Surround the flower with empty boxes or speech bubbles where text would go. Use a neat, clear style like a textbook or a science field journal. Include space for a title at the top, a heading, a main paragraph box, and a small area for a diagram label.



Label words: Title · Subheading · Fact · Paragraph · Diagram · Caption

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw a large Moon-Flower in the middle of your page. At the very top, write a clear Title for your report. Draw an arrow to point to it.
2. Step 2: Draw a small box near the flower. Write a short Fact about the flower inside it. Label this 'Fact'.
3. Step 3: Draw a bold Subheading above your fact box. Label this 'Subheading'.
4. Step 4: Draw a label pointing to your drawing of the flower and write 'Diagram'. Write a short sentence underneath the flower and label it 'Caption'.
