

Sentence Structure Flashcards with Max the Monkey

Learning objective: To identify and understand different parts of a sentence, including clauses, conjunctions, and fronted adverbials.

Read the front of the card. Try to guess the answer before checking the back. Use the word bank if you get stuck!

What is a group of words that has a subject and a verb?	Which word joins two clauses together? (e.g., and, but, so)
A clause.	A conjunction.
What do we call a sentence that has only one main clause?	What do we call a sentence that joins two clauses with a conjunction?
A simple sentence.	A compound sentence.
What is the name for a word or phrase at the start of a sentence that describes how, when, or where?	What punctuation mark do we usually put after a fronted adverbial?
A fronted adverbial.	A comma.
What must every sentence end with to show it is finished?	In the sentence 'Max jumps', which word is the subject?
A full stop.	Max.
In the sentence 'Max jumps', which word is the verb?	Which conjunction could you use to add extra information?
Jumps.	And.
Which conjunction could you use to show a choice?	Which conjunction could you use to show a reason?
Or.	Because.
