What is the term for a line on a map that shows where one country ends and another begins?	Which river flows through the capital city of the United Kingdom?
A border.	The River Thames.
What do we call a large, continuous landmass separated by oceans, of which Europe is one?	Name the capital city of France, often called the 'City of Light'.
A continent.	Paris.
Which imaginary line of latitude runs at 0 degrees and divides the Northern and Southern Hemispheres?	Is the United Kingdom located in the Northern or Southern Hemisphere?
The Equator.	The Northern Hemisphere.
Which Scandinavian country is famous for its deep coastal inlets known as fjords?	What is the name of the mountain range that acts as a natural border between France and Spain?
Norway.	The Pyrenees.
Which European country is shaped like a boot and has a capital city named Rome?	What is the name of the longest river in Europe, located in Russia?
Italy.	The Volga.
