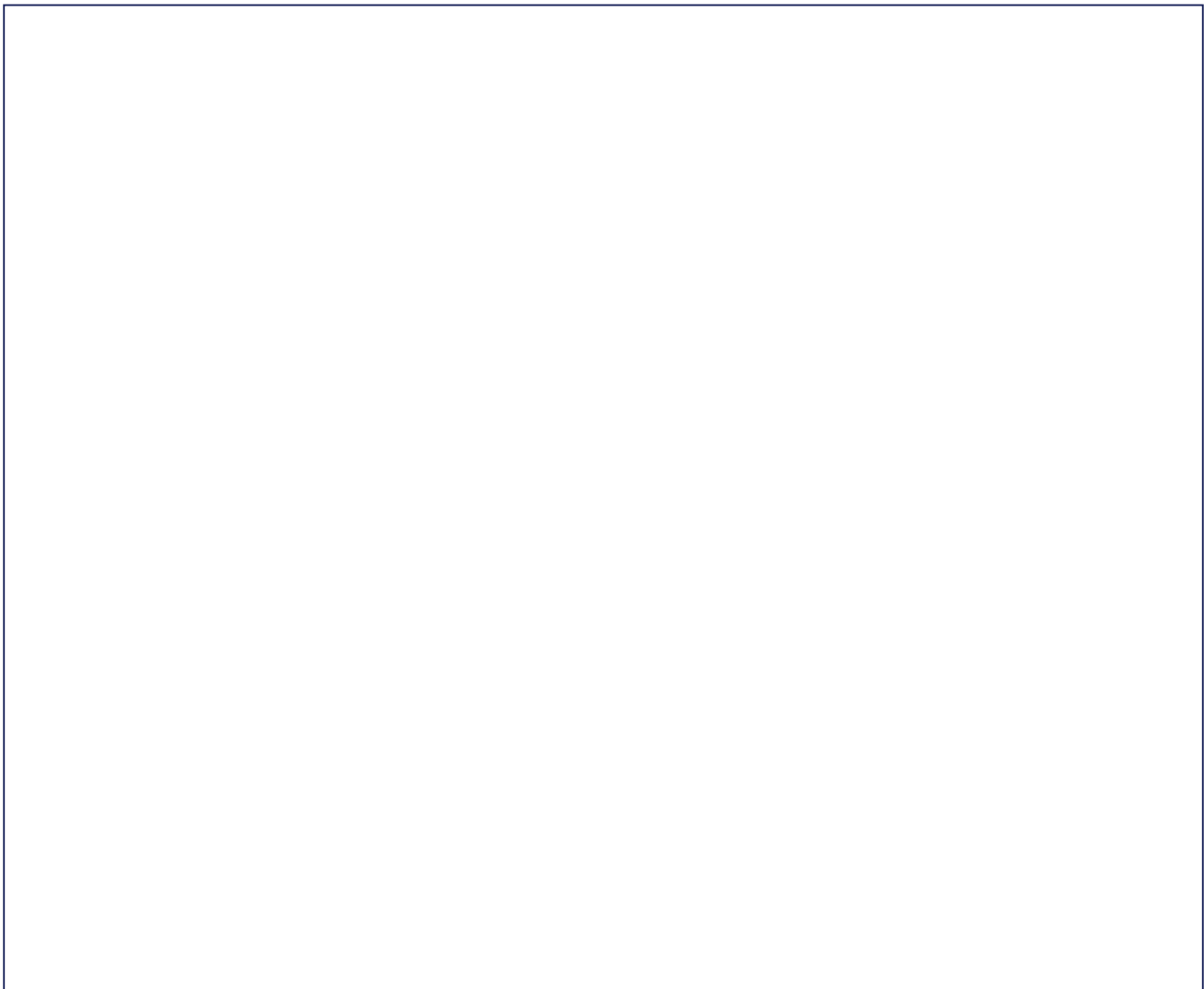


Finn's Global Trading Map

Learning objective: To understand how goods are traded between countries across the world.

Follow the steps below to draw a map showing how things travel from one place to another. Use your word bank to label your picture.

Draw: Draw a map of the world or two simple land shapes separated by blue water. Use bright colours. Include a large cargo ship in the middle. Draw dotted lines to show the path the ship takes. Add small drawings of crates or boxes on the ship to represent the 'goods' being traded. Keep the labels clear and neat.



Label words: Export · Import · Ship · Goods · Country · Route

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw two large shapes to represent two different countries. Label them 'Country A' and 'Country B'.
2. Step 2: Draw a cargo ship in the sea between the two countries. Draw an arrow to show the ship moving from Country A to Country B.
3. Step 3: Label the items leaving Country A as 'Export' and the items arriving at Country B as 'Import'.
4. Step 4: Think of one item we buy from other countries (e.g., bananas or toys). Draw it inside the ship.
