

Mapping the UK with Finn the Dolphin

Learning objective: To identify and locate the four regions of the United Kingdom on a map.

Follow the steps below to complete your map. Use the word bank to help you label each area correctly. You can use coloured pencils to make your map clear.

Draw: Draw a simple outline map of the United Kingdom showing the four main regions. Use a pencil to draw the shapes of the islands. Use different colours for each region: green for England, purple for Scotland, red for Wales, and yellow for Northern Ireland. Draw a small picture of Finn the dolphin swimming in the sea next to the map.



Label words: England · Scotland · Wales · Northern Ireland

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw a line to the top part of the map. Label this region 'Scotland'.
2. Step 2: Draw a small star in the region on the left side of the map. Label this 'Northern Ireland'.
3. Step 3: Colour the region on the west side of England blue. Label this 'Wales'.
4. Step 4: Label the largest region in the south and east as 'England'.
