2. 2. Why do we remember Rosa Parks? Write one thing she did. (2 marks)

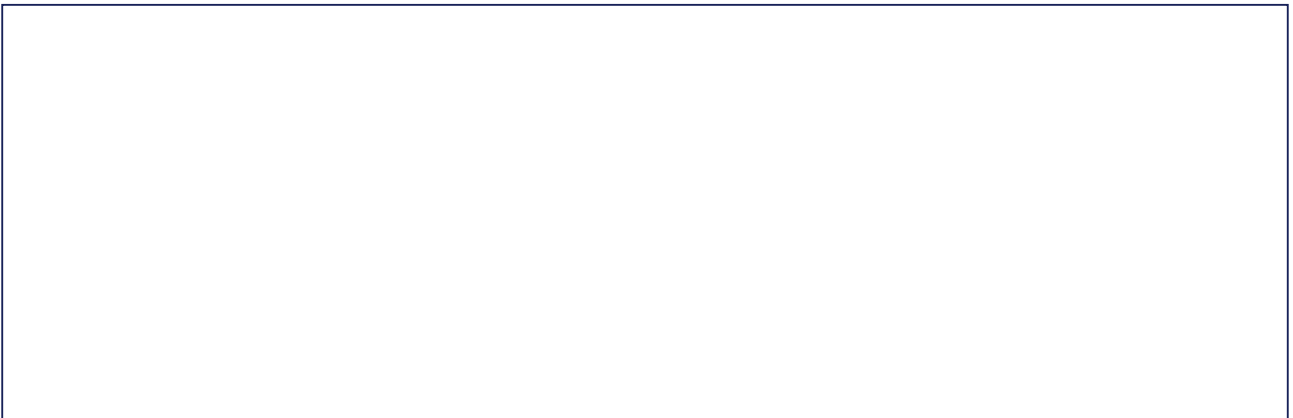
