1. In which month do we celebrate Black Social Studies / History Month in the UK? (2 marks)

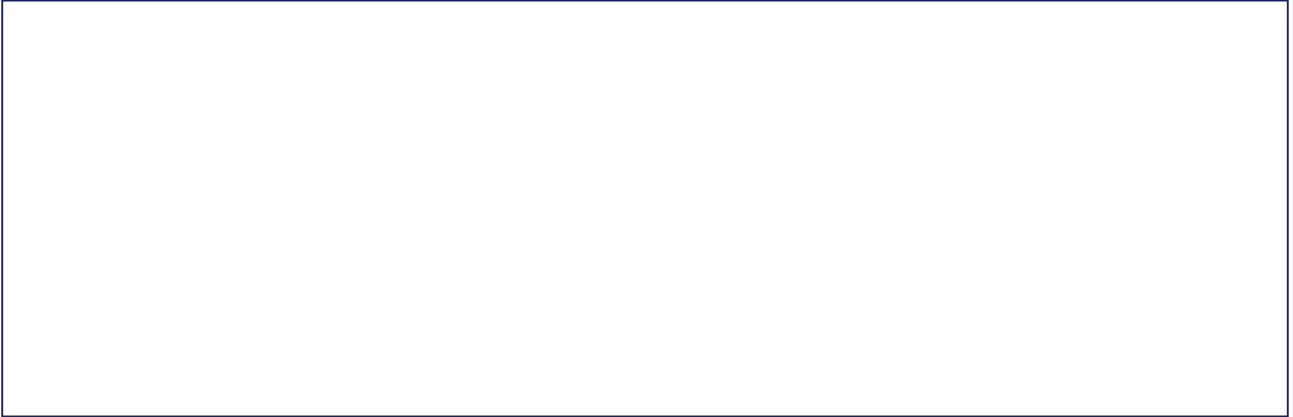
2. List two types of people mentioned in the text whose stories we learn about. (2 marks)
