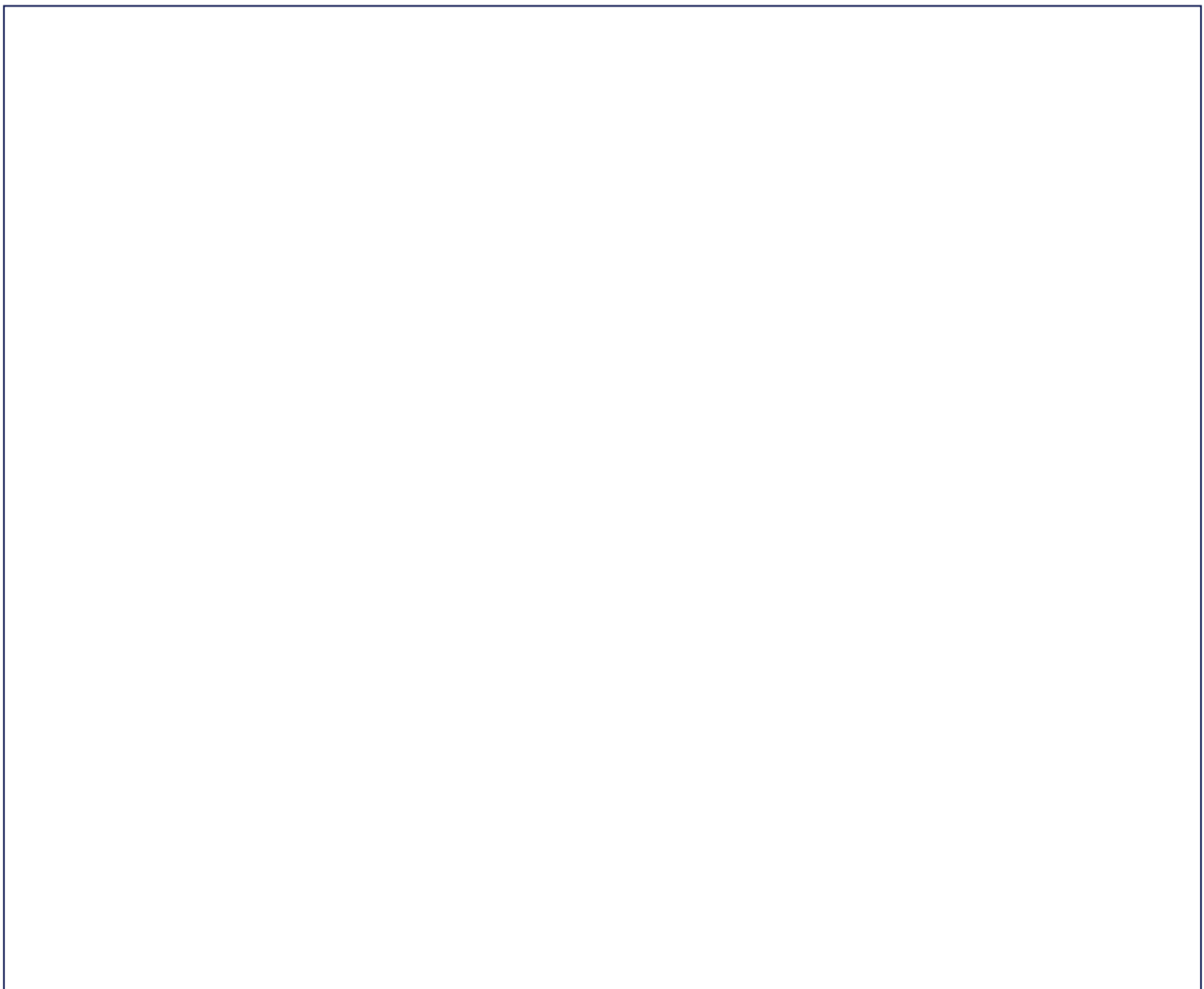


Celebrating Social Studies / History Makers: A Drawing Sheet

Learning objective: To recognise and celebrate the achievements of significant figures in Black history.

Follow the steps below to draw a tribute to a historical figure. Use your imagination to show what they achieved. Use the word bank to help you label your drawing.

Draw: Draw a portrait of a person who has made a positive change in history. Use a clear, bold style. Place the person in the middle of the frame. Around them, draw simple shapes or symbols that represent their job or their dream. For example, if they were a scientist, draw beakers; if they were a civil rights leader, draw a path or a crowd of people. Keep the lines simple and use bright colours.



Label words: Hero · Award · Social Studies / History · Change · Inspiration · Bright

Steps:

1. Step 1: Choose a person who helped change the world. Draw them in the centre of your box. What are they wearing?
2. Step 2: Draw one item near them that shows what they are famous for. For example, a book for a writer or a microphone for a speaker.
3. Step 3: Draw a bright sun or stars in the corner to show that their work makes the future bright.

4. Step 4: Use two words from the word bank to label your drawing.
