A writer who worked hard to end the slave trade in Britain.

What does 'Equality' mean?

Making sure everyone is treated with the same fairness and respect.

Who was Walter Tull?

A famous footballer and the first Black officer to lead white soldiers in the British Army.

Why do we study history?

To learn from the past so we can build a better future.

Who was Rosa Parks?

A woman whose bravery helped lead to equal rights in the United States.

What is a community?

A group of people living or working together.

Why is it important to share stories?

To remember the people who helped change the world for the better.
