Learning objective: To understand the life and contributions of Florence Nightingale and why she is a significant historical figure.

Florence Nightingale was a famous nurse who lived a long time ago. She travelled to a hospital in Scutari to look after soldiers who were hurt in a war. The hospital was very dirty and dark. Florence worked hard to make the hospital clean and she brought fresh food and medicine. At night, she walked around the wards carrying a lamp to check on the soldiers. Because of this, she became known as 'The Lady with the Lamp'. She changed how hospitals worked to help people get better faster.
