- Most houses in London were made of wood and straw, which helped the fire travel quickly.
- People tried to stop the fire by using buckets of water and long hooks to pull down houses.
- Many people escaped the flames by getting onto boats on the River Thames.
- After the fire, the city was rebuilt using brick and stone to make it much safer.
- A tall stone tower called The Monument was built to help us remember the fire today.

Did you know? Did you know? Because the houses in London were built very close together and made of wood, the fire spread across the city for four whole days!
