

Social Studies / History: Life in World War Two with Ellie the Elephant

Learning objective: To understand how life changed for children living in Britain during World War Two.

Read the questions carefully. Use the word bank to help you complete the sentences. Ellie the Elephant is here to help you remember the facts!

During World War Two, many children were sent away from cities to stay safe in the countryside. This was called evacuation. Families had to share food using ration books, and they used special shelters if there was an air raid warning. Everyone had to carry a gas mask in a small box.
